

He was the United Kingdom's bestselling author of the 1990s and has sold more than 55 million books worldwide. In 2001 he won the Carnegie Medal for his children's novel *The Amazing Maurice and his Educated Rodents*. Pratchett was appointed Officer of the Order of the British Empire for services to literature in 1998 and was knighted in 2009.
