

PreS-Gr 1—Pulp painting and collage art prevail in this creative game. On the first spread, a motorized mouse figure instructs shapes—a small arc, triangle, oval, large arc, circle, two small ovals, two tiny circles, two big rectangles, two thin rectangles, and a square—to rearrange themselves piece by piece to form a monkey. Mouse and Monkey accidentally collide, and the pieces assemble into a cat, then quickly return to the intended form. Fleming's active verbs (bounce, slide, slither, flip) create verbal energy to reflect the visual fun that keeps fresh with varying colored backgrounds. Readers can seek and find the shapes on each page, and assembling them in different ways creates an engaging interactive experience.—Gay Lynn Van Vleck, Henrico County Library, Glen Allen, VA

"Fleming's signature pulp-painted backgrounds set the stage for a performance featuring an assemblage of shapes; created from patterned handmade papers, the forms are choreographed in their activity by a madcap mouse on wheels. . . . Children will enjoy predicting at various points in the narrative. . . . Motion lines drawn with pastels combine with expressive verbs, rhyming couplets and playful phrases to animate the narrative: "Bibbity bop!" Although Fleming presents a veritable smorgasbord of early learning (shapes, colors, directions and concepts), there is also a dramatic arc with tension and humor. . . . A little mouse on wheels directs labeled geometric elements to gradually assemble themselves into a monkey figure: "Bounce, OVAL, up and down./ Roll, CIRCLE, round and round." When the mouse accidentally knocks down the assembled monkey, sending the shapes flying, they reassemble themselves not as a monkey but a cat, who chases the mouse until he makes another monkey out of new shapes. The rhyming text is contrived and sometimes awkward, and the ending is puzzling (the reassembled monkey's parts are components that weren't part of the original monkey). Nonetheless, the liveliness of the mouse's edicts and the visual breakdown of the way a larger, complex figure can be crafted by combining individual shapes will garner audience attention. The illustrations, which feature backgrounds poured by Fleming, cut shapes from handmade paper, and pastel accents, are somewhat reminiscent of the work of Lois Ehlert, down to the labeling for each shape. Some of the background colors unfortunately don't offer sufficient contrast to the shapes being arranged, making them difficult to distinguish at times. Despite its flaws, this might make a diverting precursor to art activities or a useful addition to a study of geometric shapes for the preschool or primary-grade crowds. (Bulletin February 2015)
